Big Picture

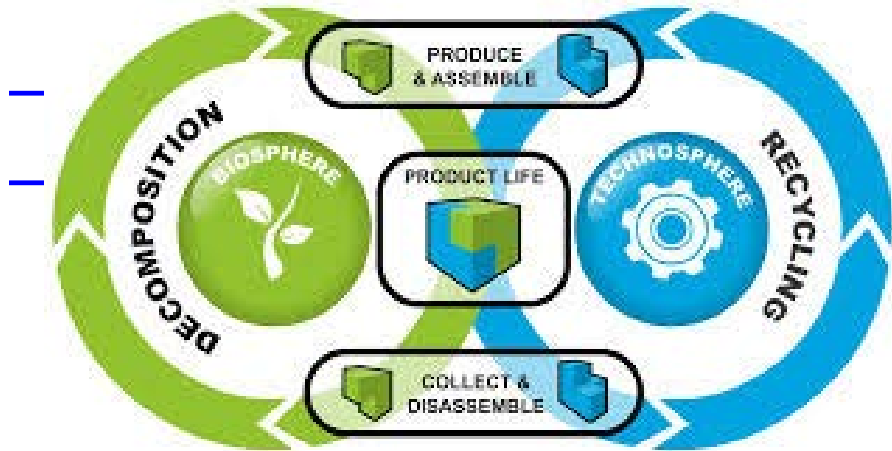
- UN Global goals for sustainable development (the really big picture!). There are 17 of them.
