Welcome to St James's Church. Whether you are in the building or online, we are glad you are here.

We extend a special welcome to those to be baptised at this service with their friends and supporters. Please hold them in your prayers.

In response to congregational feedback, we are returning to more singing during the service. Our Lay Singers, music scholars and clergy, socially distanced, will lead us in singing without face coverings. If you are in the body of the congregation, please keep your face covering on while singing. All arrangements are kept under review.

Please remember that social distancing is being observed on the Jermyn Street side of the church (on the right-hand side as you come in) both on the ground floor and at gallery level.

If you arrive late, please observe this social distance zone, and if you are sitting in these pews, please keep at least a metre away from the next person.

If you do not wish to sit distanced, then the Piccadilly side (the left-hand side as you come in) is free seating, both at ground floor and gallery level.

As we continue to evolve our arrangements, please be sensitive to those around you and

please also don't hesitate to move to a distance if you are feeling uncomfortable.

We are fortunate to have a large airy building and we hope that you will feel comfortable as we pray our way through these days.

In your mercy forgive what we have been, help us to amend what we are, and direct what we shall be, that we may do justly, love mercy, and walk humbly with you our God. Amen.

Revelation 21.1-6a

Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth; for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. And I saw the holy city, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, 'See, the home of God is among mortals. He will dwell with them; they will be his peoples, and God himself will be with them; he will wipe every tear from their eyes. Death will be no more; mourning and crying and pain will be no more, for the first things have passed away.'

And the one who was seated on the throne said, 'See, I am making all things new.' Also he said, 'Write this, for these words are trustworthy and true.' Then he said to me, 'It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. To the thirsty I will

give water as a gift from the spring of the water of life.

THE GOSPEL

John 11.32-44

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

Glory to you O Lord.

When Mary came where Jesus was and saw him, she knelt at his feet and said to him, 'Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died.' When Jesus saw her weeping, and the Jews who came with her also weeping, he was greatly disturbed in spirit and deeply moved. He said, 'Where

have you laid him?' They said to him, 'Lord, come and see.' Jesus began to weep. So the Jews said, 'See how he loved him!' But some of them said, 'Could not he who opened the eyes of the blind man have kept this man from dying?'

Then Jesus, again greatly disturbed, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone was lying against it. Jesus said, 'Take away the stone.' Martha, the sister of the dead man, said to him, 'Lord, already there is a stench because he has been dead for four days.' Jesus said to her, 'Did I not tell you that if you believed, you would see the glory of God?' So they took away the stone. And Jesus looked upwards and said, 'Father, I thank you for having heard me. I knew that you always hear me, but I have said this for the sake of the crowd standing here, so that they may believe that you sent me.' When he had said this, he cried with a loud voice, 'Lazarus, come out!' The dead man came out, his hands and feet bound with strips of cloth, and his face wrapped in a cloth. Jesus said to them, 'Unbind him, and let him go.'

THE PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

Led by a member of the congregation.

The deacon says

Let us pray for the world, for the church, for all in need and for those who have asked for our prayers.

Please kneel or sit.

BAPTISM

Please stand and turn in your seats towards the font.

As the candidates move, the chant is sung

Bless the Lord my soul and bless God's holy name. Bless the Lord my soul who leads me into life.

The priest addresses the whole congregation:

Faith is the gift of God to all people.
In baptism, Christ is adding to our number those whom he is calling.
People of God, will you welcome these as friends and uphold them in their new life in Christ?

With the help of God, we will.

THE DECISION

The priest addresses the candidates, saying

Do you wish to be baptised?

The candidates say

I do.

The priest says

In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into marvellous light.

To follow Christ means dying to sin

and rising to new life in Christ.

Therefore I ask:

Do you turn to Christ?

The candidates say

I turn to Christ.

Do you repent of your sins? I repent of my sins.

Do you renounce evil?

I renounce evil.

The priest makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of each candidate in turn saying:

Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of the cross. Do not be ashamed of Christ, to whom you belong for ever.

All say

Stand bravely with Christ against all powers of evil and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, restore in you the image of glory and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ.

Amen.

PRAYER OVER THE WATER

Praise God who made heaven and earth. **God's promise is kept forever.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

The priest continues:

We thank you, God of life, for the gift of water... *ending with* ... to you be all honour and glory, now and forever.

Amen.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

The priest addresses the whole congregation:

Sisters and brothers, I ask you to profess together the faith of the Church.

Do you believe and trust in God the Creator, source of all being and life, the one for whom we exist?

I believe and trust in God the Creator.

Do you believe and trust in God the Son, who took our human nature, died for us and rose again?

I believe and trust in God the Son.

Do you believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit who gives life to the people of God and makes Christ known in the world? I believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit.

This is the faith of the Church.

This is our faith.

We believe and trust in one God,
Creator, Christ and Holy Spirit.

THE BAPTISM

The priest addresses each candidate, saying
I baptise you in the name of the Father,
and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
Amen.

May God who has received you by baptism into the Church, pour upon you the riches of grace, that within the company of Christ's pilgrim people you may daily be renewed by the anointing of the Holy Spirit and come to the inheritance of the saints in glory.

Amen.

THE GIVING OF THE CANDLES

The priest gives a candle to each candidate, saying:

God receives you by baptism into the Church. Receive this light.

This is to show that you have passed from darkness to light.

Shine as a light in the world to the glory of God the Creator.

THE WELCOME

The priest address the candidates, saying

God receives you by baptism into the church.

We welcome you into the fellowship of faith; we are members together of the body of Christ.

We are children of the same Creator. We welcome you!

THE PEACE

The priest says

We are fellow citizens with the saints and of the household of God, through Christ who came and preached peace to those who were far off and those who were near.

The peace of the Lord be always with you. **And also with you.**

The priest says

Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

Please share the Peace in a socially distanced way if you are in the building, and in the YouTube chat function if you are online.

Sing each phrase after the Cantor

Holy, holy, holy Lord.

Heaven and earth are full of your glory,
Hosanna,
Hosanna in the highest.

The cantor sings

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord.

Sing after the cantor

Hosanna, Hosanna, Hosanna in the highest. The prayer of consecration continues recalling Christ's command to his disciples at the Last Supper, ending with: "... as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me"

The cantor sings
Great is the mystery of faith.

Sing after the cantor

Christ has died.
Christ is risen.
Christ will come again.

The prayer continues. At the end of the prayer, sing after the cantor . . .

Blessing and honour, glory and power, be yours forever and ever.

Amen.

Silence is kept.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

You are invited to pray in your own language.

The priest says

Let us pray in the words that Jesus gave us.

Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come, your will be done,
on earth as in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins
as we forgive those who sin against us.
Lead us not into temptation
but deliver us from evil.
For the kingdom, the power, and the
glory are yours, now and for ever.
Amen.

The Bread is broken and the priest says

We break this bread to share in the body of
Christ.

Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread.

This is the table of Christ. It has been made ready for those who love God and those who want to love more. So come: you who have much faith and you who have little. You who have been to this sacrament often and you who have not been for some time. You who have tried to follow Christ and you who have failed. Come. It is Christ who asks us to meet him here.

Amen.

The body of Christ keep you in eternal life. **Amen.**
