If you do not wish to sit distanced, then the Piccadilly side (the left-hand side as you come in) is free seating, both at ground floor and gallery level.

As we continue to evolve our arrangements, please be sensitive to those around you and please also don't hesitate to move to a distance if you are feeling uncomfortable.

We are fortunate to have a large airy building and we hope that you will feel comfortable as we pray our way through these days.

OPENING RESPONSES

The priest says

Eternal God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hidden; cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy name; through Christ our Lord.

PRAYER OF RECONCILIATION

The deacon says

God of miracle and wonder for whom nothing is impossible, you long to reveal yourself to us that we might reach out to you and know ourselves to be your own, cherished and chosen.

In silence we pause before you to confess our need for forgiveness and grace.

Silence is kept.

Forgive us if we have been too preoccupied or distracted to notice the extraordinary in the ordinary.

The cantor sings

Kyrie eleison, eleison. Kyrie eleison, eleison. (Lord, have mercy.)

The deacon says

Forgive us if we have failed to recognize you in the faces of both friends and strangers.

The cantor sings

Christe eleison, eleison. Christe eleison, eleison. (Christ, have mercy.)

The deacon says

Forgive us if we have let the sound of our own voices drown out your call.

The cantor sings

Kyrie eleison, eleison. Kyrie eleison, eleison.

THE ABSOLUTION

The priest says

May the God of mercy and truth forgive you and set you free. May you take God's forgiveness to heart and be at peace. **Amen.**

THE GLORIA (Taizé)

The cantor sings first then we sing once together and then twice as a 4-part round.

Gloria, Gloria in excelsis Deo. Gloria, Gloria. Alleluia, alleluia. (Glory to God in the highest. Alleluia.)

LITURGY OF THE WORD The Collect

The priest says

Let us pray.

God of all mercy, your Son proclaimed good news to the poor, release to the captives, and freedom to the oppressed: anoint us with your Holy Spirit and set all your people free to praise you in Jesus Christ.

Amen.

Please sit.

FIRST READING

1 Corinthians 12.1-11

Now concerning spiritual gifts, brothers and sisters, I do not want you to be uninformed. You know that when you were pagans, you were enticed and led astray to idols that could not speak. Therefore I want you to understand that no one speaking by the Spirit of God ever says 'Let Jesus be cursed!' and no one can say 'Jesus is Lord' except by the Holy Spirit.

Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are activated by one

and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses.

Listen for what the Spirit is saying. Thanks be to God.

Please stand.

PSALM 36 vv. 5-10

Response: For with you is the fountain of life; in your light we see light.

Your steadfast love, O Lord, extends to the heavens, your faithfulness to the clouds. Your righteousness is like the mighty mountains, your judgments are like the great deep; you save humans and animals alike, O Lord.

How precious is your steadfast love, O God! All people may take refuge in the shadow of your wings.

They feast on the abundance of your house, and you give them drink from the river of your delights.

For with you is the fountain of life; in your light we see light.

Continue your steadfast love to those who know you, and your salvation to the upright of heart!

THE GOSPEL

John 2.1-11

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

Glory to you O Lord.

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' And Jesus said to her, 'Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.' Now standing there were six stone water-jars for the Jewish rites of purification,

each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to them, 'Fill the jars with water.' And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, 'Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward.' So they took it. When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom and said to him, 'Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now.' Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you O Christ.**

Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

During the hymn, a collection will be taken.

OFFERTORY HYMN

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

The priest continues the Church's prayer of thanksgiving ...

SANCTUS AND BENEDICTUS (Williams)

Sing each phrase after the cantor

Holy, holy, holy Lord.
God of power and might,
Heaven and earth are full of your glory,
Hosanna,
Hosanna in the highest.

The cantor sings

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord. Sing after the cantor

Hosanna, Hosanna, Hosanna in the highest.

The prayer of consecration continues recalling Christ's command to his disciples at the Last Supper, ending with: "... as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me"

The cantor sings

Great is the mystery of faith.

Sing after the cantor

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

The prayer continues. At the end of the prayer, sing after the cantor . . .

Blessing and honour, glory and power, be yours forever and ever. Amen.

Silence is kept.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

You are invited to pray in your own language.

The priest says

Rejoicing in the presence of God here among us, let us pray in the words that Jesus gave us.

Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come, your will be done,
on earth as in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins
as we forgive those who sin against us.
Lead us not into temptation
but deliver us from evil.
For the kingdom, the power, and the
glory are yours, now and for ever.
Amen.

The Bread is broken and the priest says
We break the bread of life,
and that life is the light of the world.

God here among us, light in the midst of us, bring us light and life.

Christ is the true bread come from heaven. The body of Christ keep you in eternal life. **Amen.**

During Communion, the Lay Singers and Scholars will sing **O Almighty God**, the BCP Collect for Epiphany 2 set to music by George Barcrofte (c. 1555-1610)
