BIOGRAPHIES

Mark Dangerfield was born in Amersham, Buckinghamshire in 2001. Having played the

guitar since the age of eight and taking part in his local guitar ensemble, Mark began to show musical promise in secondary school, remaking pop songs and composing music to share with friends. Later Mark began playing in the classical style after being inspired by recordings of Julian Bream, and his playing retains stylistic influences of flamenco, jazz and rock. In 2021 Mark was selected for further study of the guitar with Professors Carlos Bonell and Christopher Stell at the Royal College of Music in London, and has since pursued studies in composition, now taking a Joint Principal study of Composition and Classical Guitar. Alongside his studies Mark enjoys a regular performing schedule in and outside of London, and is just as comfortable performing in cafes as he is in the concert hall. Mark has appeared in numerous lunchtime concerts as well as in festivals - having recently been invited to the Amersham Festival of Music concert series, the Festival of Classical Guitar Music at the Victoria Hall in Highgate and the Royal College of Music's 'Super Strings' festival at the Amaryllis Fleming Hall.
