Risen Christ, your wounds declare your love for the world and the wonder of your risen life: give us compassion and courage to risk ourselves for those we serve, to the glory of God.

FIRST READING Acts 8.26-end

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

Then an angel of the Lord said to Philip, 'Get up and go towards the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza.' (This is a wilderness road.) So he got up and went. Now there was an Ethiopian eunuch, a court official of the

Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, in charge of her entire treasury. He had come to Jerusalem to worship and was returning home; seated in his chariot, he was reading the prophet Isaiah. Then the Spirit said to Philip, 'Go over to this chariot and join it.' So Philip ran up to it and heard him reading the prophet Isaiah. He asked, 'Do you understand what you are reading?' He replied, 'How can I, unless someone guides me?' And he invited Philip to get in and sit beside him. Now the passage of the scripture that he was reading was this:

'Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter, and like a lamb silent before its shearer, so he does not open his mouth. In his humiliation justice was denied him. Who can describe his generation? For his life is taken away from the earth.' The eunuch asked Philip, 'About whom, may I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?' Then Philip began to speak, and starting with this scripture, he proclaimed to him the good news about Jesus. As they were going along the road, they came to some water;

and the eunuch said, 'Look, here is water! What is to prevent me from being baptized?' He commanded the chariot to stop, and both of them, Philip and the eunuch, went down into the water, and Philip baptized him. When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord snatched Philip away; the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing. But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he was passing through the region, he proclaimed the good news to all the towns until he came to Caesarea.

Listen for what the Spirit is saying.

PSALM 22 vv.25-end

Response: The poor shall eat and be satisfied.

My praise is of you in the great congregation; I will perform my vows in the presence of those that fear you. The poor shall eat and be satisfied; those who seek you shall praise you: "May your heart live for ever!"

All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to you, and all the families of the nations shall bow before you. For yours is the royal power, O God; you rule over the nations. How can those who sleep in the earth bow down in worship, or those who go down to the dust kneel before you?

My soul shall live for you; my descendants shall serve you; they shall be known as yours for generations to come. They shall come and make known to a people yet unborn the saving deeds that you have done.

THE GOSPEL John 15.1-8

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John. **Glory to you O Lord.**

I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine-grower. He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit. You have already been cleansed by the word that I have spoken to you. Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much

fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples.

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you O Christ.**

Don't lose your vote - act now!

With the election for London Mayor coming up on 2nd May, don't miss your opportunity to vote and be heard!



If you're not already on the electoral roll in your area, you can register to vote online at www.gov.uk/register-to-vote or download and complete the form and send it to your Electoral Registration office. To cast you're your vote in person at a polling station, you must now show an accepted form of Voter ID.

Forms of Voter ID accepted are:

- UK passport or photocard driving licence
- Blue Badge
- Biometric residence permit (BRP)
- Defence Identity Card (MOD form 90)
- Identity card bearing the Proof of Age Standards Scheme hologram (a PASS card)
- Older Person's Bus Pass, Disabled Person's Bus Pass, Oyster 60+ Card, Freedom Pass

If you do not have one of the accepted photo IDs you can now apply for a **Free Voter Authority Certificate**. This can be done online at: https://www.electoralcommission.org.uk/voting-and-elections/voter-id/applying-a-voter-authority-certificate

The London Mayoral Elections take place on 2nd May.

The deadline for registering to vote is 16th April. The deadline for applying for the Voter Authority Certificate is 24th April.
