If ye love me, keep my commandments, and I will pray the Father, and he shall give you another comforter, that he may 'bide with you forever, e'en the sp'rit of truth.

OPENING HYMN

PRAYER OF RECONCILIATION

The deacon says

Let us make our confession to God, acknowledging all that separates us from Christ ascended today.

Silence is kept.

God of Resurrection, who brings new life in Christ: we confess our need for your grace, but that we have yet sinned through ignorance and self-seeking, and through turning aside from your life. We have squandered your gifts, failed to live by your vision, and allowed injustice in our world. Raise us, we pray, to live the fullness of the life to which you call us, that we may love you with our whole heart, and our neighbours as ourselves, in Jesus Christ the risen Lord. Amen.

THE ABSOLUTION

The priest says

May the God who is both power and love forgive you and free you from your sin; give you healing and strength, and raise you to new life in Christ. **Amen.**

LITURGY OF THE WORD The Collect

The priest says

Risen Christ, you have raised our human nature to the throne of heaven: help us to seek and serve you, that we may join you at God's side where you reign with the Spirit in glory, now and for ever.

Amen.

FIRST READING Acts 1.1-11

In the first book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus did and taught from the beginning until the day when he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. After his suffering he presented himself alive to them by many convincing proofs, appearing to them over the course of forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While staying with them, he ordered them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for the promise of the Father. 'This', he said, 'is what you have heard from me; for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now.'

So when they had come together, they asked him, 'Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.' When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up towards heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, 'Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up towards heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven.'

Listen for what the Spirit is saying. **Thanks be to God.**

PSALM 47

Response: O sing praises to God, sing praises.

Clap your hands together, all you peoples; O sing to God with shouts of joy. For God Most High is to be feared; God is the great Ruler over all the earth.

God subdued the peoples under us and the nations under our feet. God has chosen our heritage for us, the pride of Jacob, whom God loves.

God has gone up with a merry noise, the Lord with the sound of the trumpet. O sing praises to God, sing praises; sing praises to our Ruler, sing praises.

For God is the Ruler of all the earth; sing praises with all your skill. God reigns over the nations; God is seated upon the holy throne.

The nobles of the peoples are gathered together with the people of the God of Abraham. For the powers of the earth belong to God who is highly exalted.

THE GOSPEL Luke 24.44-end

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke. **Glory to you O Lord.**

Then he said to them, 'These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you-that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled.' Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, 'Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things. And see, I am sending upon you what my Father promised; so stay here in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high.'

Then he led them out as far as Bethany, and, lifting up his hands, he blessed them. While he was blessing them, he withdrew from them and was carried up into heaven. And they worshipped him, and returned to Jerusalem with great joy; and they were continually in the temple blessing God.

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you O Christ.**

AFFIRMATION OF FAITH (The Apostles' Creed)

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

The priest says

Blessed be God, by whose grace Creation is renewed, by whose love heaven is opened, by whose mercy we offer our sacrifice of praise **Blessed be God for ever!**

The priest leads the Church's Thanksgiving for Creation and Redemption in Christ ...

The Lord be with you. And also with you.

Lift up your hearts. We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

The priest continues the Church's prayer of thanksgiving ...

SANCTUS (Williams)

Sing each phrase after the cantor

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, Heaven and earth are full of your glory, Hosanna, Hosanna, Hosanna in the highest.

The cantor sings

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord.

All sing after the cantor

Hosanna, Hosanna, Hosanna in the highest.

The prayer of consecration continues recalling Christ's command to his disciples at the Last Supper, ending with: "...as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me"

The cantor sings

Great is the mystery of faith.

All sing after the cantor

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again. The prayer continues ... At the end of the prayer, sing after the cantor.

Blessing and honour, glory and power, be yours for ever and ever. Amen.

Silence is kept.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

You are invited to pray in your own language.

The priest says

Let us pray in the words that Jesus gave us.

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and for ever. Amen. The Bread is broken and the priest says

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ. Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread.

INVITATION TO COMMUNION

The priest says

This is the table of Christ. It has been made ready for those who love God, and those who want to love more. So come; you who have much faith and you who have little. You who have been to this sacrament often and you who have not been for some time. You who have tried to follow Christ and you who have failed. Come. It is Christ who asks us to meet him here.

THE COMMUNION

During Communion the Lay Singers and Singing Scholars will sing *Sing Joyfully*, Psalm 81 vv1-4 (Genevan Bible), set to music by William Byrd (c.1540-1623).

Sing joyfully to God our strength; sing loud unto the God of Jacob! Take the song, bring forth the timbrel, the pleasant harp, and the viol. Blow the trumpet in the new moon, even in the time appointed, and at our feast day. For this is a statute for Israel, and a law of the God of Jacob. *A Prayer for Spiritual Communion* inspired by Richard of Chichester (1198-1253)

Thanks be to you, Christ Jesus, for all the benefits you have given me for all the pains and insults you have borne for me. Since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, I ask you to be present with me spiritually in my heart. O most merciful redeemer, friend and brother, may I know you more clearly, love you more dearly, and follow you more nearly, day by day. Amen.

Prayers for use during Communion

Christ Jesus, you promised in your gospel 'I am with you always'. Be with me as part of this community today in this Eucharist; Hear my prayers for others and for myself. May I bind myself to you, in communion with all that lives this day, knowing that nothing can separate me from your love. Amen.

O God, help me to trust you, and to know that you are with me now. Help me to know that all are yours, and you are ours, in this Eucharist and for ever. Amen.

PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION

Eternal God, you have raised our humanity in Christ and have fed us with the bread of heaven: mercifully grant that, nourished with such spiritual blessings, we may set our hearts in the heavenly places; through Jesus Christ our Redeemer. Amen.
