LITURGY OF THE WORD The Collect

The priest says

Amen.

Holy God, who gathers us here around the table of Christ to share this meal with the whole household of God. In that new world, where you reveal the fulness of your peace, gather people of every race and language to share in the eternal banquet of your Son Jesus Christ our Redeemer.

FIRST READING Hebrews 11.29-12.2

A reading from the Letter to the Hebrews.

By faith the people passed through the Red Sea as if it were dry land, but when the Egyptians attempted to do so they were drowned. By faith the walls of Jericho fell after they had been encircled for seven days. By faith Rahab the prostitute did not perish with those who were disobedient, because she had received the spies in peace.

And what more should I say? For time would fail me to tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, of David and Samuel and the prophets— who through faith conquered kingdoms, administered justice, obtained promises, shut the mouths of lions, quenched raging fire, escaped the edge of the sword, won strength out of weakness, became mighty in war,

put foreign armies to flight. Women received their dead by resurrection. Others were tortured, refusing to accept release, in order to obtain a better resurrection. Others suffered mocking and flogging, and even chains and imprisonment. They were stoned to death, they were sawn in two, they were killed by the sword; they went about in skins of sheep and goats, destitute, persecuted, tormented— of whom the world was not worthy. They wandered in deserts and mountains, and in caves and holes in the ground. Yet all these, though they were commended for their faith, did not receive what was promised, since God had provided something better so that they would not, apart from us, be made perfect.

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God.

Listen for what the Spirit is saying.

THE PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

The deacon says

Let us pray for the world, for the church, for all in need and for those who have asked for our prayers.

Please kneel or sit for prayers led by a member of the congregation.

BAPTISM

Parents and godparents move to the font, and the congregation turns to face them, singing ...

Bless the Lord my soul and bless God's holy name. Bless the Lord my soul who leads me into life.

The priest addresses the whole congregation.

Faith is the gift of God to all people. In baptism, Christ is adding to our number those whom he is calling. People of God, will you welcome Rosalind and uphold her in her new life in Christ?

We will.

THE DECISION

The priest addresses Rosalind through her parents and godparents.

In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into marvellous light. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life in Christ.

Therefore I ask:
Do you turn to Christ?
I turn to Christ.

Do you repent of your sins? I repent of my sins.

Do you renounce evil? I renounce evil.

The priest makes the sign of the cross on Rosalind's forehead.

Christ claims you for his own.

Receive the sign of the cross.

Do not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified.

Fight valiantly against sin, the world and the devil, and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, restore in you the image of glory and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ. **Amen.**

PRAYER OVER THE WATER

Praise God who made heaven and earth.

God's promise is kept forever.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give thanks and praise.

The priest continues:

We thank you, God of life, for the gift of water to sustain, refresh and cleanse all life.

Over water the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation.

Through water you led the children of Israel

from slavery in Egypt to freedom in the Promised Land.

In water your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us from the death of sin to newness of life.

We thank you, Eternal God, for the water of baptism.

In it we are buried with Christ in his death.

By it we share in his resurrection.

Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit.

Therefore, in joyful obedience to your Son,

we baptize into Christ's fellowship those who come to him in faith.

Now sanctify this water that, by the power of your Holy Spirit, they may be cleansed from sin and born again.

Renewed in your image, may they walk by the light of faith and continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Lord; to whom with you and the Holy Spirit

be all honour and glory, now and for ever.

THE BAPTISM

The priest says

Rosalind Joanna, I baptise you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.** May God who has received you by baptism into the Church, pour upon you the riches of grace, that within the company of Christ's pilgrim people you may daily be renewed by the anointing of the Holy Spirit and come to the inheritance of the saints in glory.

Sanctuary Eucharist on Tuesdays at 6.30pm

The team who run the Sanctuary Eucharist on Tuesdays have decided, with the support of St Pancras and St James's clergy, that the weekly service will remain at St Pancras until 2027.

As part of the partnership between the two churches, the Sanctuary congregation is an important element of our getting to know each other, and praying together. If the Wren Project is able to go ahead on schedule, St James's congregation would move to St Pancras in the first quarter of 2027.

The Sanctuary Eucharist will therefore stay at St Pancras until that time. It is our privilege to worship together and we hope that this stability of venue will ensure that the congregation can grow and build on what is already there.

Everyone is welcome to join Sanctuary for silent prayer at 6pm and the Eucharist at 6.30pm every Tuesday. Refreshments are served after the service too.



Supporting The Wren Project - come and join St Pancras congregation on Sundays!

If The Wren Project goes ahead on schedule, the St James's congregation will move to St Pancras in the first quarter of 2027 for the Sunday Eucharist. Our partnership is developing, but It will be a big change for both congregations, and that will feel more natural if we get to know each other better first.

The Sanctuary Eucharist on a Tuesday evening has started the process and will be staying at St Pancras until 2027.

Attendance at the Sunday Eucharist at SJP is much larger and there is potential to overwhelm. In the first instance we are looking for volunteers from SJP to join 4/5 small groups of people who would commit to attending the 11am service at St Pancras once a month (approx).
